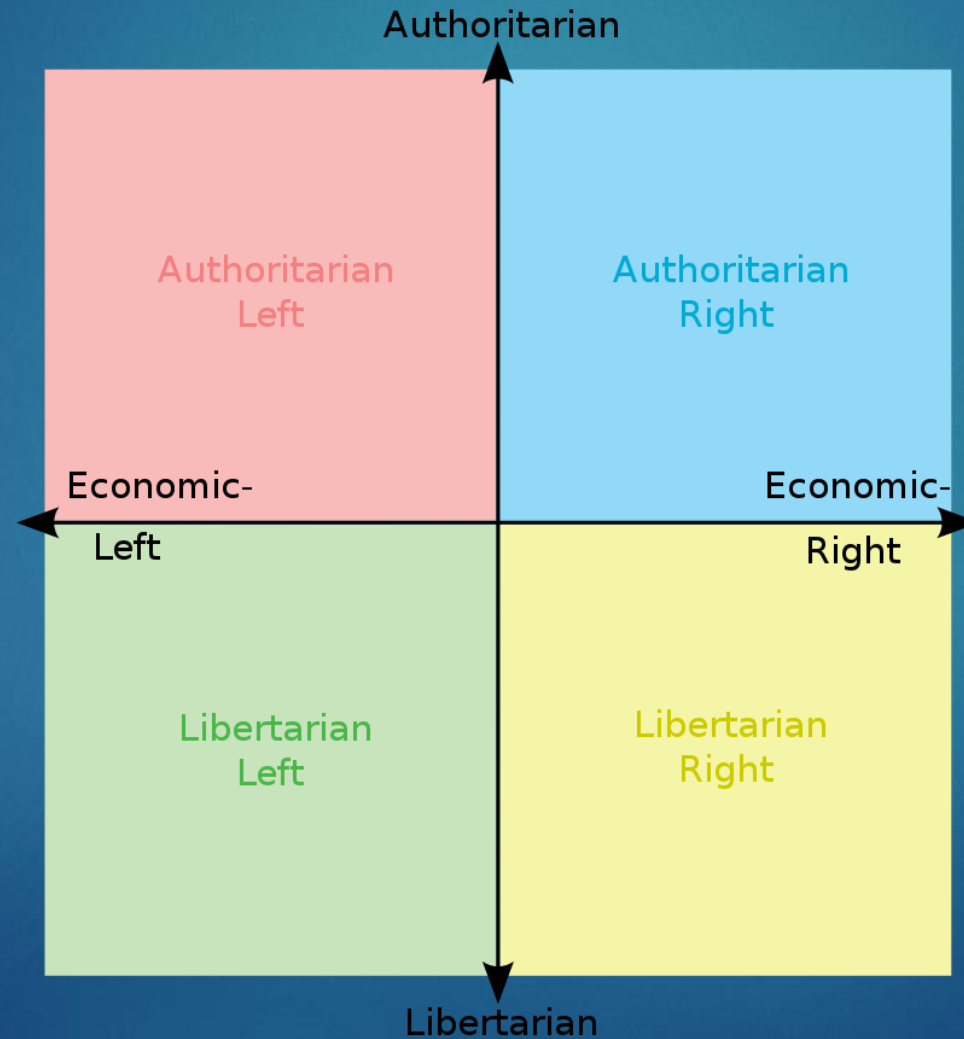

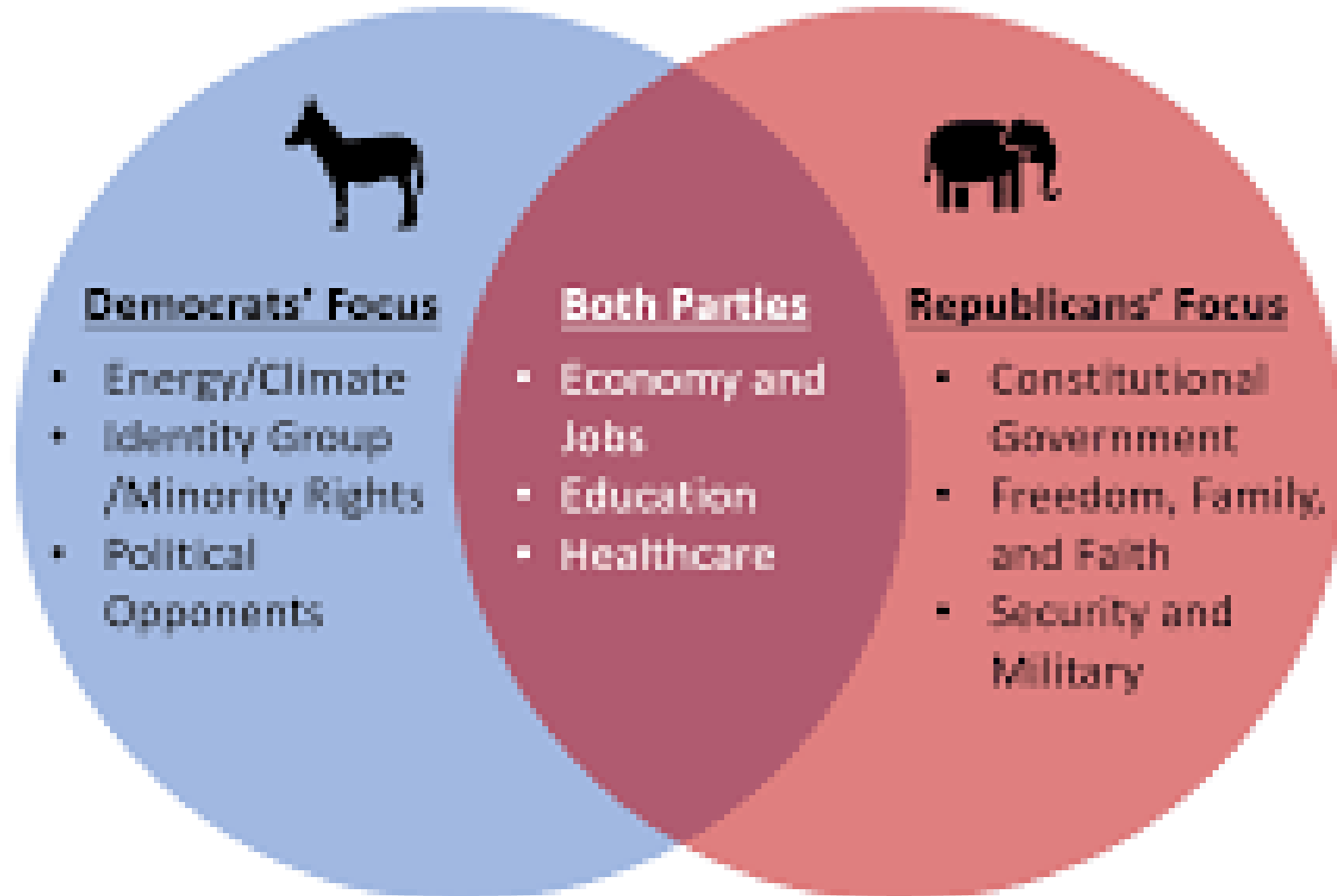
- ▶ The liberal-conservative spectrum: wedge v. valence issues

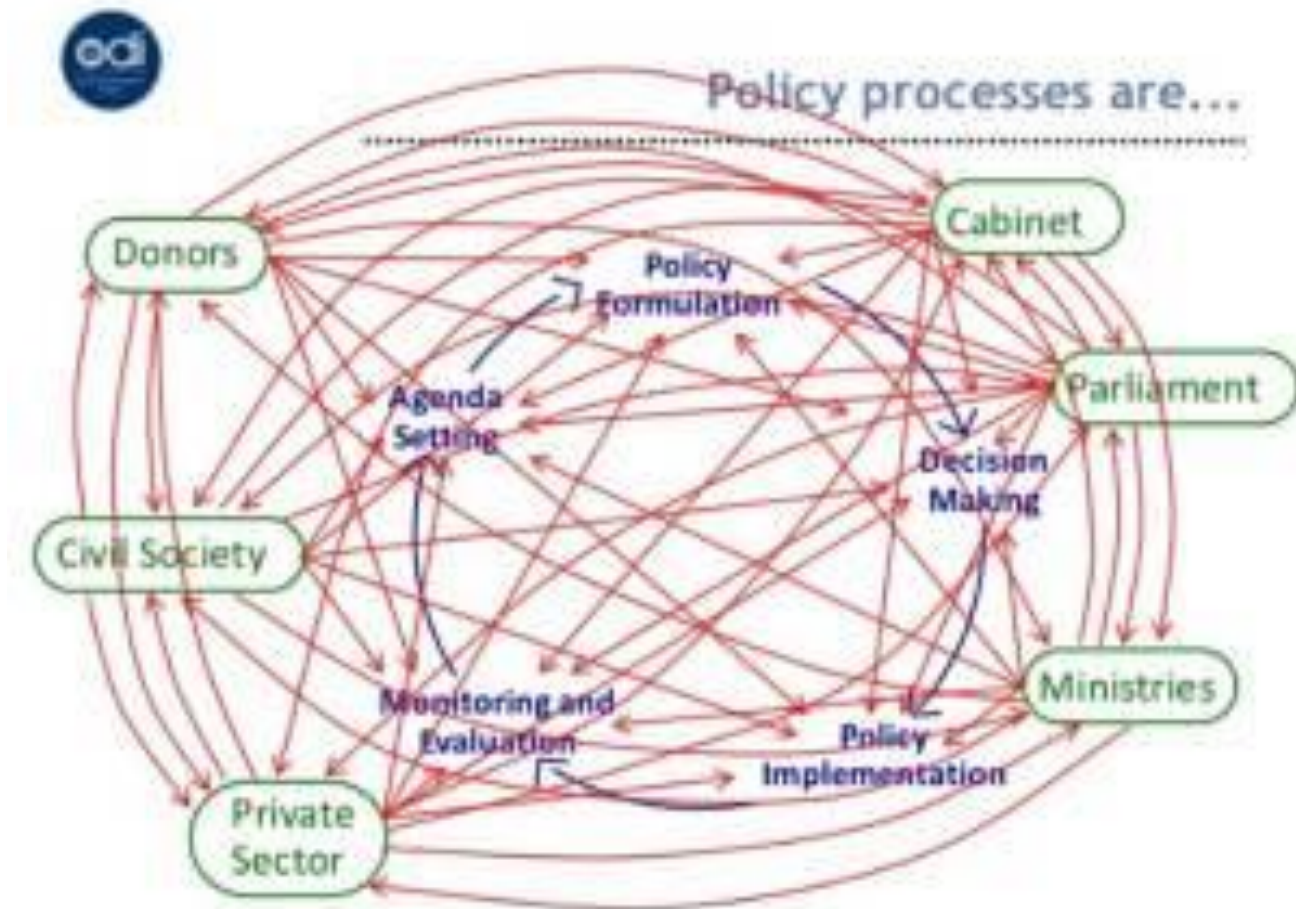
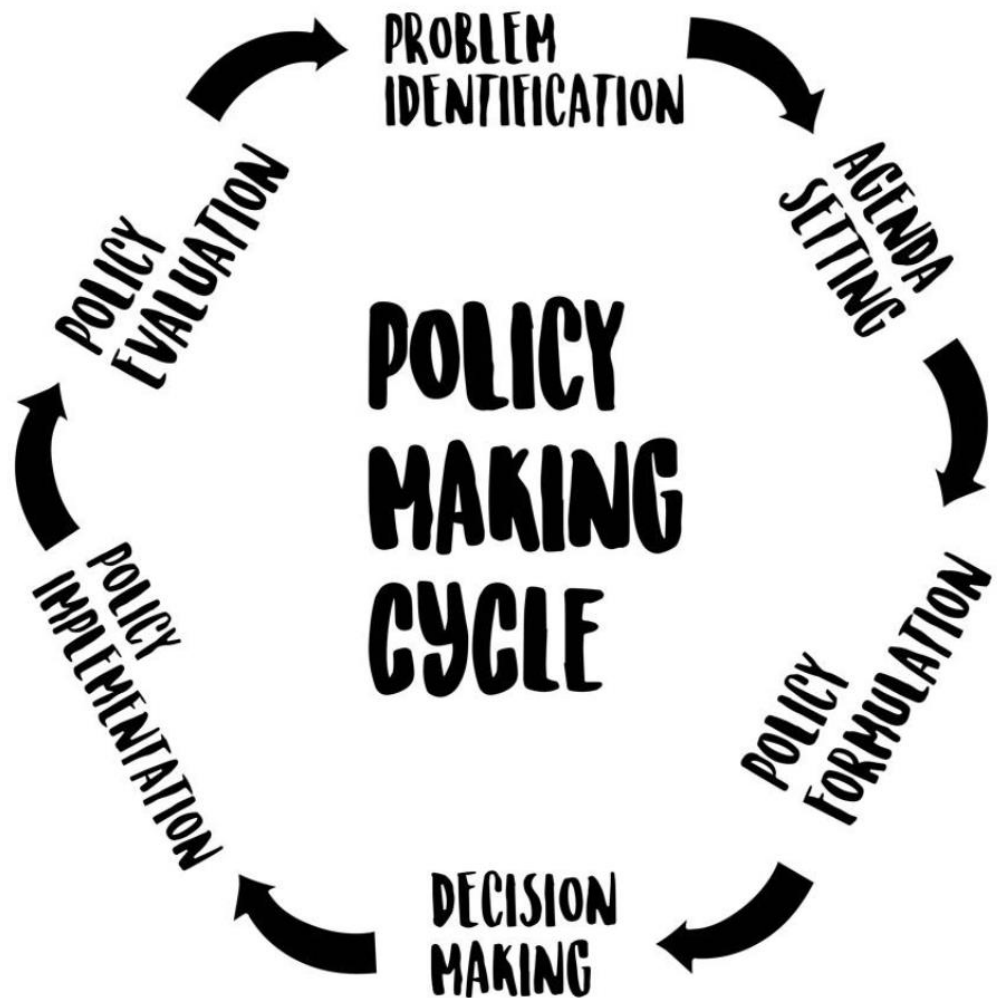


Don't Tread On Anyone
